The new version of MWDE will provide users with the current data entry capabilities and will enhance the SRP process to make it more streamlined and efficient.

New Capabilities.....


◆ The latest addition to MWDE is the new Expanded Women's Readiness module. The current access allows authorized users with expanded access to view the new Expanded Women's Readiness screens and prepare for full implementation. Users can access additional Single Medical Readiness Reports for Units/ Task Forces for Women's Readiness (formerly Pap Smears); Chlamydia (required for females 17-25 years), and Mammograms (required for females =>40 years of age). In addition, those new fields will appear on the Individual Medical Readiness record in web reporting (under the Lab section).

◆ Another addition is the Pregnancy/Post Partum Physical Training (PPPT) module. The intent is to allow PPPT Program Managers the ability to add dates for PPPT program Soldiers. It will give the user the ability to post start and end dates for the PPPT program, as well as the Soldier Status. In addition, it will also display historical data for all completed PPPT enrollments.

◆ The Soldier Readiness Processing (SRP) Checklist implemented significant changes, enhancing the ability for users to effectively execute a standardized SRP checklist. Modifications to the SRP Check In page within MWDE will give providers the ability to add individual immunizations to the selected profiles. MWDE users will be able to add immunizations to a profile, but will not be able to delete. When added, the immunization status will reflect a NOGO for any immunizations that are required but not current. In addition, all SRP Checklist data will be presented on the DD Form 2766 PDF form with all corresponding data elements on the SRP Checklist form updated real-time. The completed DD Form 2766 link will be present on the SRP Check In screen. Lastly, MWDE will provide the user with the ability to batch print the SRP Checklist. When the user selects PRINT SRP Checklist, as well as the IMM and IMR records.

New Capabilities.....

- ◆ **Dental Drilldowns added to MEDPROS Web Reporting.**
Users may now select a Dental UMR Command Drilldown to see the Dental Readiness status of their subordinate UICs, with more precise breakout of DRCs 1 thru 4, and combinations (1&2; 3&4). This drilldown is built on Army command structure like other drilldowns from the MACOM level down to individual unit rosters. Another Dental Drilldown, built on DENCOM Regional Dental Command supported populations will be available in the near future and will show similar DRC breakout statistics, but will be aligned to match the Regional Dental Commands, their DENTACs, the clinics associated with those DENTACs, then finally the UICs and personnel rosters associated with those supported UICs.
- ◆ **UMR Command Drilldowns Continue Refinement.**
The MEDPROS team took another step forward to aligning the Command Drilldowns (UMR, HIV, DNA, Dental, Seasonal and H1N1 Influenza) to the latest approved Army Structure (Army Commands (ACOMs); Army Service Component Commands (ASCCs); Direct Reporting Units (DRUs), and the National Guard. All MACOM ASG's have been eliminated or placed directly under their respective Command's Parent UICs. The DOD Structure has been completed as well, creating three distinct DOD entities (Ofc Sec Def; NATO Command, and Joint Commands, minus NATO) at level one of the drilldown. In addition, the MEDPROS team is pursuing the realignment of the Sec Army structure to better represent their actual Command/reporting hierarchy in the drilldown.



Still to come.....

- ◆ MEDPROS will transition from the current "Fully Medically Ready" (FMR) classification system to the new Medical Readiness Classification (MRC) categories to identify Soldier/Unit Medical readiness posture. New Capabilities.....

- ◆ Users can now update their registration information to include their medical specialty (i.e. MD, PA) to assist in denoting a Provider’s credentials on the signature line of the DA 3349. Go to My Account, then Registration Information and select the correct value in the drop down. All new profiles will now include the two-position code indicating the selected medical specialty and will be included with signature (i.e., John Smith, COL, MD).
- ◆ Contextual help has been added to the Profile Module. This feature will provide basic explanations regarding a specific feature or field. This will be enhanced over time.
- ◆ Users now have the ability to select which Provider a profile will be routed to for 1st or 2nd signature. Although the profile will still be available to all users in the Provider Pool for action, this new feature will allow Providers to assign a profile to a specific Provider / Approval Authority.
- ◆ Filtering capabilities have been added to the profile inboxes to assist in finding a profile and narrowing searches for profiles needing action. In addition, you can now select ‘all’ in the ‘rows per page’ drop down.
- ◆ Users now have the ability to export their Profile results (i.e., View All Profiles) and inboxes to a spreadsheet. This will help manage workload and provide reporting capabilities.
- ◆ All users have the ability to add administrative comments to a profile. The comment is optional; it is only visible from within the application and will not be seen on the DA 3349. Please note this comment is visible to anyone who has access to the electronic profile in the e-Profile application.





Still to come.....

- ◆ A temporary profile will be created upon 1st signature of a permanent profile. Once the permanent profile is approved, the temporary profile will expire.
- ◆ Temporary profiles (greater than 30 days) in MEDPROS, including the automatic posting of the MND flag will be implemented. Once a temporary profile expires, the MND flag will automatically revert back to N (if no current permanent condition exists).
- ◆ The ability for Providers to create custom templates will be added.
- ◆ A revised DA 3349 Form will be implemented.

New Capabilities.....

- ◆ Soldiers and PHA providers can archive forms that are over 30 days old. Soldiers are restricted to archiving forms that have not been edited or saved by a provider. If a provider archives a form they must provide a reason for archiving the form. The archiving feature will allow Soldiers and Providers the ability to start a new form if needed and still maintain having only one active form in process at a time.
- ◆ The cardiac terms on the family history tab have been changed from medical terminology to layman's terminology. This change makes it easier for Soldiers to select the correct condition in the family history portion of the form.
- ◆ A link to Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) and feedback have been added to each tab of the form. The addition of these two items assists Soldiers and Providers in attaining help related to the part of the form they are completing.
- ◆ Admin users can run a report of all PHAs completed by a provider. In addition, they can now search for a user by SSN as well as by AKO ID.

Still to come.....

- ◆ An Administrative User Role is going to be added. This user role will be able to view and print forms and run reports. The user will not have data entry capabilities. This user will be able to assist in completing the administrative tasks related to the PHA without having the medical training requirement. Due to the content of the PHA the user will be required to have HIPAA training.

Medical Readiness Classification

- ◆ MODS added a new column to the Command Drill Down that reflects the current status of the Medical Readiness Classification (MRC) for the Unit and Soldiers.
- ◆ In the near future, the MRC will replace the current Fully Medically Ready (FMR) status for the Soldier. The MRC provides the Soldier Medical Readiness Status as those who are “ready” or “available” that may not necessarily be deployable.
- ◆ **NOTE** - This does not include combat exemptions for those deployed, commander exemptions, or PHA/Dental exemptions. This a management tool for the Commander and Unit Leaders to predict the MRC status of their unit when the MRC becomes mandated without consideration of current exemption status.
- ◆ The release of AR 40-501, Chapter 11, Paragraph 11-5 reflects the change to the MRC. The MRC is also referenced in AR 220-1 as a replacement for current FMR to assess Soldier availability.
- ◆ Each Soldier will be assigned a Medical Readiness Classification. All Soldiers with an MRC 1 or 2 will be considered a Go and all Soldiers with an MRC 3A, 3B, or 4 will be considered a No Go. The overall classification will be based on the lowest classification for a Soldier. This will be based on the following criteria:
 - ◆ MRC 1 – Meets all Requirements and Dental Readiness Class 1
 - ◆ MRC 2 – Correctable within 72 hours. Soldier is Deficient in one of the following:
 - ◆ Immunizations
 - ◆ Dental Readiness Class 2
 - ◆ Medical Warning Tags
 - ◆ HIV
 - ◆ DNA
 - ◆ MRC 3A - Correctable within 30 Days. Soldier is Deficient in one of the following:
 - ◆ Dental Readiness Class 3
 - ◆ Future changes will include Hearing, vision, and women’s health readiness
 - ◆ MRC 3B - Correctable in more than 30 days. Soldier is Deficient in one of the following:
 - ◆ Pregnancy
 - ◆ MND Y
 - ◆ LDP Y
 - ◆ Physical Category X
 - ◆ MRC 4 – Status is unknown. Soldier is Deficient in one of the following:
 - ◆ Periodic Health Assessment
 - ◆ Dental Readiness Class 4
- ◆ Commanders and Leaders should be using the MRC for USR calculation in accordance to the final draft of AR 220-1. The MRC in this report is provided in the MEDPROS reports to ensure Commanders and Leaders start corrective actions and ensure the highest compliance with the standards of the new of AR 220-1.
- ◆ Since the release of AR 220-1, the MRC automatically transfers to the Defense Readiness Reporting System (DRRS-A) to populate the medical portion of the USR report for the Commander.
- ◆ Future MEDPROS enhancements will include the ability to easily assess the readiness and all known deficiencies for a Soldier or unit.
- ◆ **NOTE:** The PHA is determined a GO if the Soldier has an exam or PHA within the past 15 months.
